Derek and I have been on an overseas adventure. Who'd have thought we would find orchids within days of motoring off in Scotland! And they were plentiful.

These are Early Purple Orchids, Orchis mascula. They can display up to 50 light to dark purple flowers, arranged in a dense, cone-shaped cluster on a tall spike. The lower lip of each flower has three lobes and the upper petals form a hood. It is often found in habitats with non-acidic soils, such as hedgerows, banks, ancient

woodland and open grassland.

Plectochilus Kilgra grown by M Coker



Plectochilus Kilgra is an orchid hybrid originated by S.Penman in 1988. It is a cross of Sarco. falcatus x

Plrhz. tridentata. It is considered a "primary hybrid" because it is a cross between two species.

It needs high humidity (around 80%) and good air movement, along with intermediate to cool growing temperatures between 9-25°C. Grow it mounted on tree fern or in a small pot with excellent drainage, using a loose, airy medium like orchid bark or sphagnum moss. Water moderately, allowing the medium to dry slightly between waterings, and use filtered water or rainwater. Provide bright, indirect light, and fertilize lightly during the growing season. (growing information comes from SSOS, 2018)

This Month's article

Lots of members asked Alan Rogers for more information about his award winning **Dinema Polybulbon**, which not only won Grand Champion orchid at our Winter Show, also won Champion Miniature Growing & Flowering Specimen at the OSCOV Show. So Alan has very kindly written the following notes to help us all grow these wonderful orchids better.

Found from Mexico to Nicaragua and also in Jamaica and Cuba, in humid mixed forests on oaks as a miniature-sized, warm to cold-growing epiphyte or lithophyte, at elevations of 600 to 3200 metres. It was originally known as Encyclia polybulbon.



Whilst classified as a miniature due to its flower and pseudobulb size, *Dinema polybulbon* can become a large specimen due to its vigorous and rambling growth habit. This plant was purchased in 2017 from Mike Pender as a 100mm division and then mounted on a 40cm x 50cm tree fern slab which is now almost completely covered. The main flush of 30mm diameter flowers in early spring is followed by sporadic blooming until mid-summer.



This plant is grown in an unheated greenhouse covered with 50% shade cloth mid-September to early April. The greenhouse is fitted with a humidity-controlled misting system and a fan to circulate air as Dinema polybulbon thrives in a humid environment with plenty of air movement. Most new growth occurs over summer with watering and fertilising increased to facilitate this as the weather warms up. During the winter rest period, watering is cut back to weekly or even once every two weeks if the weather is particularly cold and damp.
